JEFFERSON COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS REGULAR SESSION October 21, 2014

The Board met this date in regular session. Present were Chairperson Betsy Barfield, Commissioners Benjamin "Benny" Bishop, Hines Boyd, John Nelson and Stephen Walker. Also present were County Coordinator Parrish Barwick, County Attorney Buck Bird and Clerk of Court Kirk Reams.

ITEM 1: Call to Order, Invocation, Pledge of Allegiance

1. Luis Lugo-Munoz gave the invocation and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

ITEM 3: Consent Agenda

2. On motion by Commissioner Walker, seconded by Commissioner Nelson and unanimously carried, the Board approved the consent agenda—consisting of the approval of the agenda, minutes of the September 16th, 2014 Tentative Budget Hearing, minutes of the September 30th, 2014 Final Budget Hearing, minutes of the October 7th, 2014 Regular Session and the Health Department Contract—was approved.

ITEM 4: Citizens Request and Input on Non-Agenda Items

3. TDC Director Nancy Wideman informed the Board that the TDC would be receiving \$100,000 in funding from VisitFlorida to attend travel shows and that this money could be used as matching funds towards other grant programs that provided for additional marketing efforts.

ITEM 6: PUBLIC HEARING: First Reading – Land Development Code Ordinance

4. Planning Attorney Scott Shirley read the introduction to ordinance no. 2014-081914-01 and submitted a memorandum outlining changes made since August 12th, 2014. Commissioner Bishop asked if all meetings of the Planning Commission relating to the land development code had been advertised as public hearings, to which Attorney Shirley responded in the affirmative. Chairperson Barfield stated she would like to see the Board move forward with a strikeout version so that she would be able to see the changes made. It was the consensus of the Board to include the language describing the changes in the memo submitted by Attorney Shirley. Citizen Marcia Elder submitted her comments to Attorney Shirley. Commissioner Bishop stated he appreciated the effort to make the land development code a simpler document.

ITEM 5a: North Barber Hill Road SCRAP Resolution

 Clerk of Court Kirk Reams introduced this item and stated that FDOT had extra money in the SCRAP program that allowed this project to be brought forward from next fiscal year. On motion by Commissioner Nelson, seconded by Commissioner Walker and unanimously carried, the Board approved resolution no. 2014-102114-01.

ITEM 5b: VAB Hearing / Tax Roll Extension

6. Property Appraiser Angela Gray stated that if the Board approved this request from the Tax Collector, then the VAB could sign off on a preliminary tax roll at its organizational meeting, allowing the tax bills to be sent off as close to November

1st as possible. On motion by Commissioner Bishop, seconded by Commissioner Boyd and unanimously carried, the request was approved.

ITEM 7a: County Coordinator / SHIP Bids and Certification of Annual Report

7. County Coordinator Parrish Barwick introduced this item. Commissioner Walker spoke of concern with the type of work done by a contractor on a project in his district. Commissioner Walker asked if the Board should move forward with the projects that were low bids except for the three where the previous contractor was the low bidder. County Coordinator Parrish Barwick asked to table this issue so that accusations would cease until more information could be gathered. It was the consensus of the Board to table this item. On motion by Commissioner Nelson, seconded by Commissioner Walker and unanimously carried, the Board approved the certification of the annual report.

ITEM 7b: County Coordinator / Land Purchase Discussion

- 8. County Coordinator Parrish Barwick stated there was a business that had interest in a lot at the Industrial Park and that the Board should consider a process for dealing with properties there. He stated he would work closely with EDC Director Julie Conley and bring some suggestions at a future meeting.
- 9. County Coordinator Parrish Barwick reported on two cross county races recently held at Green Industries that brought in several hundred visitors to the area. Chairperson Barfield stated that the Board needed to develop a game plan on how to market the site for future events.
- 10. County Attorney Buck Bird stated that the Board needed to approve the release of the sub-lease that North Florida Community College had at the Green Industries site. On motion by Commissioner Nelson, seconded by Commissioner Walker and unanimously carried, the release was approved.

ITEM 8: Commissioner Discussion Items

- 11. Commissioner Walker stated that he had a meeting with Preble-Rish to kickoff activities for the Wacissa Headwaters springs restoration project.
- 12. Commissioner Nelson stated that citizen Dennis Gallon was appreciative of the proclamation recognizing his 90th birthday.

- 13. The warrant register was reviewed and bills ordered paid.

MEMORANDUM

RE: AMERICAN HUNTER PROJECT

Despite our best efforts to salvage it, the American Hunter project is now officially dead. For a number of reasons, the company's owners decided to scrap plans to relocate their retail internet business to Jefferson County. The owners would like to re-convey their 7.11 acre parcel to the County in exchange for the original purchase price of \$59,200. They have also agreed to give the County a complete set of building plans and specifications for a 35,000 square foot warehouse. The cost of the plans was approximately \$30,000. Their other option is to offer the property for sale on the open market.

In light of the infrastructure improvements and the increased property values in the area, I would recommend the County re-purchase the parcel and market it as a shovel-ready site. In reality, it lacks access to the City's central sewer system but that can be overcome.

In this business, it's not unusual to work on a project for several years only to have it fall apart. However, that doesn't make the current situation any less disappointing. The good news is that we're working on several other projects and, overall, activity has increased.

The EDC remains optimistic and appreciates your continued support.

Commissioners & Coordinator:

In July 2014, EMS received Board approval and authority to move forward with 2 Grants.

The first Grant (#R3002) for \$90,312.15 was to purchase 3 Cardiac Monitors and to have 3 year service contracts on them. The State portion was \$81,280.94 and the match for Jefferson County was \$9,031.21 with a small overage of \$184.90. These monitors have been purchased and the Grant is being closed out.

The second Grant (#M3003) for \$133,333.00 was to purchase an ambulance and stretcher. The State portion was \$100,000.00 and the match for Jefferson County was \$33,333.00. The stretcher was purchased during County Fiscal Year 2013-2014 but due to circumstances outside of the Counties control, the ambulance will not be ready for delivery, inspection and payment until the beginning of the next calendar year. Therefore, we are requesting additional budget authority in the County Fiscal Year 2014-2015 EMS budget to expend an additional \$123,956 to purchase this ambulance. This total consist of State Grant Funds carried over from last Fiscal Year of \$92,500, a County match of 30,833 and a small overage of \$623.00 to complete this purchase.

The additional County funds (\$31,456) will come out of the Counties Contingency Reserve. Thank you for your attention to this matter.

Dear Commissioners,

As most of you know our SCBA air bottles will go out of date and can no longer be used at the end of this year. Our airpacks were purchased in the year 2000 are four NFPA Standards old. Our air compressor is twenty five years old and is the only one in the County. They all need to be replaced. We have been applying for AFG grants to replace these for the last three years and even though they meet the AFG program criteria as a high priority for funding, we have not been successful. I just received confirmation two weeks ago that we were not funded. We are now at a point that these items need to be purchased and in service before the end of the year.

I am requesting that we be allowed to purchase the following:

- Eighteen Self Contained Breathing Apparatus, 6 for JCFR, 4 for MVFD, 4 for LVFD, and 4 for WVFD. Ashville at this time does not have anyone capable of making entry into a house fire and will not be issued any SCBA at this time. Cost \$67,500
- 2) Forty two SCBA 30 minute bottles, 24 for the volunteers and 18 JCFR. Cost \$28,098
- 3) Thirty two Face masks. 12 for the volunteers and 20 for JCFR. Cost \$8,000
- 4) 6000psi breathing grade air compressor. Cost \$22,275
- 5) Fill station with manual cascade. Cost \$9,125
- 6) Two RIT PAK III Assemblies and two 45 minute bottles. 1 for MVFD and 1 for JCFR. This is for the use of a Rapid Intervention Team to provide breathing air and equipment

to a firefighter who has become trapped or in-capitated in a fire. This is critical life safety equipment that we currently do not have. Cost \$6,502

Earlier in the year, we researched the various SCBA's available and we were able to test the model in the quote for two months and found it to be satisfactory and will meet our needs. They will be brand new but built under the 2007 NFPA standard and are available for immediate purchase. If we were to purchase the newest version of SCBA built to the 2013 standard that was just released, it would cost an additional \$24,000 with no real improvement in technology with a delivery date past our bottle expiration date.

We will be able to piggyback this purchase on a bid by Osceola County. This will enable us to complete this purchase and have the SCBA's in place before the first of the year.

I would like to fund this purchase by entering into a 5 year lease purchase agreement. We would be required to place a down payment of \$14,150 with the first of five annual payments of \$28,205.65 beginning one year from now. I will be able to fund this purchase within the existing fire budget and will still maintain a Capital Improvement/Reserve fund of \$70,000 this year.

My request is for permission purchase these items from Municipal Emergency Services with a total purchase price of \$141,500 by entering into a 5 year Lease/Purchase Agreement. The purchase will be piggy-backed on an Osceola County bid due to time constraints. The purchase will be 100% funded by the Fire Budget and will require no additional funds from the County.
