### JEFFERSON COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS Regular Session April 20, 2017

The Board met this date in regular session. Present were Chairman Gene Hall, Commissioners Betsy Barfield, Stephen Fulford, J.T. Surles and Stephen Walker. Also present were County Attorney Buck Bird, County Coordinator Parrish Barwick and Clerk of Court Kirk Reams.

- 1. Commission Fulford led the invocation and pledge of allegiance.
- 2. Jennifer Johnson with the Jefferson County Health Department presented the Board with a Healthy Weight Community Champion Award.
- 3. Aucilla Regional Landfill Engineer Frank Darabi gave a presentation to the Board on the operations of the regional landfill.
- 4. Planning Director Bill Tellefsen gave a presentation to the Board on the operations of the Planning Department.
- 5. On motion by Commissioner Walker, seconded by Commissioner Surles and unanimously carried, the consent agenda—consisting of the approval of the agenda, General/Transportation Fund Vouchers, and CDBG Housing Change Order—was approved.
- 6. Citizen Keith Cook expressed interest in seeing a gun range established at the closed landfill on Tyson Road. It was the consensus of the Board for Mr. Cook to get with the Sheriff's Department on the management and maintenance plan for such a facility.
- 7. David Fox with Fox Enterprises presented the CDBG Rehab/Replace bid packet #2. On motion by Commissioner Barfield, seconded by Commissioner Walker and unanimously carried, the Board approved packet #2 as presented. Commissioner Barfield inquired as to whether the Board would be interested in allowing mobile homes to be replaced with stick built homes. It was the consensus of the Board to move forward with language being provided at a future meeting.
- 8. Citizen Paul Henry presented the Recreation Park Donation request item. It was the consensus of the Board to move forward with obtaining donation funding for the concession building.
- 9. On motion by Commissioner Walker, seconded by Commissioner Surles and unanimously carried, the Board decided to no longer entertain requests for public/private partnerships with relation to economic development projects where the county was involved in the debt financing. Commissioner Barfield stated she would like to see some guiding principles in order for the Economic Development Council to have better direction related to projects.
- 10. Planning Attorney Scott Shirley introduced the second reading of Ordinance No. 2017-042017-01, regarding the medical cannabis dispensary moratorium. On motion by Commissioner Walker, seconded by Commissioner Surles, and unanimously carried, the Board approved the ordinance.

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- 11. On motion by Commissioner Walker, seconded by Commissioner Surles and unanimously carried, the following projects were added to the County Road Improvement List: the ends of St. Augustine Road, Lacapra Road and Dove Road.
- 12. Planning Attorney Scott Shirley presented a letter on behalf of the Board objecting to SB 596, which relates to the placement of utility poles in rights of way. **On motion by Commissioner Fulford, seconded by Commissioner Barfield and unanimously carried, the Board approved sending the letter to the legislature.**
- 13. Commissioner Barfield gave updates on the RESTORE Act, US-90 paving project and the Bike giveaway.
- 14. The warrant register was reviewed and bills ordered paid.
- 15. On motion by Commissioner Walker, seconded by Commissioner Fulford and unanimously carried, the meeting was adjourned.

### JEFFERSON COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS Regular Session May 4, 2017

The Board met this date in regular session. Present were Chairman Gene Hall, Commissioners Betsy Barfield, Stephen Fulford, J.T. Surles and Stephen Walker. Also present were County Attorney Buck Bird, County Coordinator Parrish Barwick and Clerk of Court Kirk Reams.

- 1. Chairman Hall led the invocation and pledge of allegiance.
- 2. Chairman Hall presented a proclamation recognizing Ruth Ann Scurry for her years of volunteer service to the Extension Office.
- 3. On motion by Commissioner Walker, seconded by Commissioner Barfield and unanimously carried, the consent agenda—consisting of the approval of the agenda, the minutes of the April 6<sup>th</sup>, 2017 Regular Session, General/Transportation Fund Vouchers, Small Grant Program application/Aucilla River Institute, Child Welfare Professional Resolution and National Public Works Week Proclamation—was approved.
- 4. Citizen Willie Tyson expressed concern about a potential gun range at the Tyson Road landfill area.
- 5. Bruce Ballister with the Apalachee Regional Planning Commission discussed introduced the CDBG County Policy update. He explained that CDBG required the county policy include language regarding non-use of excessive force during peaceful demonstrations. On motion by Commission Walker, seconded by Commissioner Fulford and unanimously carried, the Board approved the policy update.
- 6. Bruce Ballister, with the ARPC, introduced the CDBG County Purchasing Policy update. He explained that CDBG required an updated version including federal regulations. On motion by Commission Walker, seconded by Commissioner Fulford and unanimously carried, the Board approved the policy update.
- 7. County Coordinator Parrish Barwick presented local housing assistance program proposed changes involving language that allowed the replacement of mobile homes with stick, site-built homes. On motion by Commissioner Barfield, seconded by Commissioner Walker and unanimously carried, the language was approved with limits of up to two mobile home replacements per cycle.
- 8. On motion by Commissioner Walker, seconded by Commissioner Surles and unanimously carried, the Board gave County Coordinator Parrish Barwick authority to move forward with utilizing Madison County to help with a Building Department certification issue.
- 9. County Coordinator Parrish Barwick stated that the Economic Development workshop would begin at 6 pm prior to the regularly scheduled Board meeting on May 18<sup>th</sup>, 2017. Commissioner Barfield requested that the City of Monticello be invited to participate in the workshop.
- 10. Clerk of Court Kirk Reams announced that the next meeting would have the following items on the agenda: Phase 2 of the US-19 beautification grant, the

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Wacissa River Headwaters Park LWCF agreement and the Beth Page Road low bidder award. He also stated that at the second meeting in June, the Freeman Road low bidder award would be on the agenda.

- 11. Commissioner Fulford announced that the NFEDP would be holding a regular meeting at the Monticello Opera House on May 18<sup>th</sup> from 9:30 am until 12 noon.
- 12. Commissioner Barfield stated that she had requested funding for the Curtis Mill Road bridge repair and that FDOT approved funding of approximately \$21,000 for repairs.
- 13. Chairman Hall requested a sign on US-19 indicating where the Fire Rescue Department building was located. It was the consensus of the Board to request signage from FDOT.
- 14. The warrant register was reviewed and bills ordered paid.
- 15. On motion by Commissioner Barfield, seconded by Commissioner Walker and unanimously carried, the meeting was adjourned.

## JEFFERSON COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS Regular Session May 18, 2017

The Board met this date in regular session. Present were Chairman Gene Hall, Commissioners Stephen Fulford, J.T. Surles and Stephen Walker. Also present were County Attorneys Buck Bird and Scott Shirley, County Coordinator Parrish Barwick and Deputy Clerk Charles Culp.

- 1. Chairman Hall called the meeting to order.
- 2. Anne Holt, introduced incoming Executive Director of Main Street Thomas Randall.
- 3. On motion by Commissioner Walker, seconded by Commissioner Surles and unanimously carried, the consent agenda—consisting of the approval of the agenda, General/Transportation Fund Vouchers, TDC/Chamber of Commerce amended agreement—was approved.
- 4. Rob Davis, with county engineering firm Dewberry, introduced the Beth Page Road item. He presented the Board with CIGP bids and explained that CW Roberts had a lower base bid, but that Capital Asphalt was the low bidder with the two alternates included. The Board discussed the different options on this item. On motion by Commissioner Walker, seconded by Commissioner Surles and unanimously carried, the Board approved Capital Asphalt as the low bidder with all options included at \$299,928.
- 5. Rob Davis introduced the second phase of US-19 Beautification project item. The Board discussed this item and County Coordinator Parrish Barwick expressed concerns with maintenance costs related to this item. Commissioner Fulford made a motion to table this item until the Board was presented with maintenance cost information at a future meeting. Commissioner Surles seconded the motion. Clerk of Court Kirk Reams stated June 1st was the deadline for this grant application. Commissioner Fulford withdrew his motion and Commissioner Surles withdrew his second. On motion by Commissioner Walker, seconded by Commissioner Surles and unanimously carried, the Board approved moving forward with the grant application, with the understanding that work on the city portion of the project would move forward right away while the Board explored maintenance costs associated with the County's portion.
- 6. Rob Davis introduced the Wacissa Headwaters Park LWCF Grant agreement. After discussion, it was the consensus of the Board that some of the BP money could be utilized as the County's match. On motion by Commissioner Walker, seconded by Commissioner Fulford and unanimously carried, the Board approved the grant agreement.
- 7. Rob Davis introduced the Curtis Mill Bridge Repair SCOP agreement. On motion by Commissioner Surles, seconded by Commissioner Walker and unanimously carried, the Board approved the SCOP agreement.
- 8. County Coordinator Parrish Barwick stated his intent to purchase a mosquito sprayer with some of his excess funds in the mosquito control budget.

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- 9. Clerk of Court Kirk Reams updated the Board on the tax deed certificate process.
- 10. County Attorney Scott Shirley addressed a permitting issue in the County. He stated that Camp Warrior had been notified of the permitting requirements but to date had not complied. On motion by Commissioner Walker, seconded by Commissioner Fulford and unanimously carried, the Board gave Mr. Shirley permission to contact Camp Warrior and explain they cannot continue camp until they meet the permitting requirements.
- 11. The warrant register was reviewed and bills ordered paid.
- 12. On motion by Commissioner Walker, seconded by Commissioner Fulford and unanimously carried, the meeting was adjourned.

The Tourist Development Council of Jefferson County would like to request to be on the agenda for the June 1, 2017 Board of County Commissioners meeting regarding an increase of Tourist Development Tax (Bed Tax) of 1 - percent bringing the total to 3 - percent. This Tourist Development Tax is only derived from our lodging facilities and does not affect our county residents.

Jefferson County Tourist Tax is the lowest percent in our surrounding area which is currently a minimum of 2 – percent. Madison County receives 3 – percent; Leon County receives 5 – percent; and Taylor County receives 3 – percent. Attached is a chart showing the comparison of all Tourist Development Tax Rates in Florida.

GOVERNMENT

125.0104 Tourist development tax; procedure for levying; authorized uses; referendum; enforcement.—

- (1) SHORT TITLE.—This section shall be known and may be cited as the "Local Option Tourist Development Act."
  - (2) APPLICATION; DEFINITIONS .-
- (a) Application.—The provisions contained in chapter 212 apply to the administration of any tax levied pursuant to this section.
  - (b) Definitions.-For purposes of this section:
- 1. "Promotion" means marketing or advertising designed to increase tourist-related business activities.
- 2. "Tourist" means a person who participates in trade or recreation activities outside the county of his or her permanent residence or who rents or leases transient accommodations as described in paragraph (3)(a).
- 3. "Retained spring training franchise" means a spring training franchise that had a location in this state on or before December 31, 1998, and that has continuously remained at that location for at least the 10 years preceding that date.
  - (3) TAXABLE PRIVILEGES; EXEMPTIONS; LEVY; RATE.—
- (a)1. It is declared to be the intent of the Legislature that every person who rents, leases, or lets for consideration any living quarters or accommodations in any hotel, apartment hotel, motel, resort motel, apartment, apartment motel, roominghouse, mobile home park, recreational vehicle park, condominium, or timeshare resort for a term of 6 months or less is exercising a privilege which is subject to taxation under this section, unless such person rents, leases, or lets for consideration any living quarters or accommodations which are exempt according to the provisions of chapter 212.
- 2.a. Tax shall be due on the consideration paid for occupancy in the county pursuant to a regulated short-term product, as defined in s. 721.05, or occupancy in the county pursuant to a product that would be deemed a regulated short-term product if the agreement to purchase the short-term right were executed in this state. Such tax shall be collected on the last day of occupancy within the county unless such consideration is applied to the purchase of a timeshare estate. The occupancy of an accommodation of a timeshare resort pursuant to a timeshare plan, a multisite timeshare plan, or an exchange transaction in an exchange program, as defined in s. 721.05, by the owner of a timeshare interest or such owner's guest, which guest is not paying monetary consideration to the owner or to a third party for the benefit of the owner, is not a privilege subject to taxation under this section. A membership or transaction fee paid by a timeshare owner that does not provide the timeshare owner with the right to occupy any specific timeshare unit but merely provides the timeshare owner with the

opportunity to exchange a timeshare interest through an exchange program is a service charge and not subject to taxation under this section.

- b. Consideration paid for the purchase of a timeshare license in a timeshare plan, as defined in s. 721.05, is rent subject to taxation under this section.
- (b) Subject to the provisions of this section, any county in this state may levy and impose a tourist development tax on the exercise within its boundaries of the taxable privilege described in paragraph (a), except that there shall be no additional levy under this section in any cities or towns presently imposing a municipal resort tax as authorized under chapter 67-930, Laws of Florida, and this section shall not in any way affect the powers and existence of any tourist development authority created pursuant to chapter 67-930, Laws of Florida. No county authorized to levy a convention development tax pursuant to s. 212,0305, or to s. 8 of chapter 84-324, Laws of Florida, shall be allowed to levy more than the 2-percent tax authorized by this section. A county may elect to levy and impose the tourist development tax in a subcounty special district of the county. However, if a county so elects to levy and impose the tax on a subcounty special district basis, the district shall embrace all or a significant contiguous portion of the county, and the county shall assist the Department of Revenue in identifying the rental units subject to tax in the district.
- (c) The tourist development tax shall be levied, imposed, and set by the governing board of the county at a rate of 1 percent or 2 percent of each dollar and major fraction of each dollar of the total consideration charged for such lease or rental. When receipt of consideration is by way of property other than money, the tax shall be levied and imposed on the fair market value of such nonmonetary consideration.
- (d) In addition to any 1-percent or 2-percent tax imposed under paragraph (c), the governing board of the county may levy, impose, and set an additional 1 percent of each dollar above the tax rate set under paragraph (c) by the extraordinary vote of the governing board for the purposes set forth in subsection (5) or by referendum approval by the registered electors within the county or subcounty special district. No county shall levy, impose, and set the tax authorized under this paragraph unless the county has imposed the 1-percent or 2-percent tax authorized under paragraph (c) for a minimum of 3 years prior to the effective date of the levy and imposition of the tax authorized by this paragraph. Revenues raised by the additional tax authorized under this paragraph shall not be used for debt service on or refinancing of existing facilities as specified in subparagraph (5)(a)1. unless approved by a resolution adopted by an extraordinary majority of the total membership of the governing board of the county. If the 1-percent or 2-percent tax authorized in paragraph (c) is levied within a subcounty special taxing district, the additional tax authorized in this paragraph shall only be levied therein. The provisions of paragraphs (4)(a)-(d) shall not apply to the adoption of the additional tax authorized in this paragraph. The effective date of the levy and imposition of the tax authorized under this paragraph shall be the first day of the second month following approval of the ordinance by the governing board or the first day of any subsequent month as may be specified in the ordinance. A certified copy of such ordinance shall be furnished by the county to the Department of Revenue within 10 days after approval of such ordinance.
- (e) The tourist development tax shall be in addition to any other tax imposed pursuant to chapter 212 and in addition to all other taxes and fees and the consideration for the rental or lease.
- (f) The tourist development tax shall be charged by the person receiving the consideration for the lease or rental, and it shall be collected from the lessee, tenant, or customer at the time of payment of the consideration for such lease or rental.

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- (a) This section is adopted pursuant to and in accordance with F.S. § 336.025, and other applicable law.
- (b) There is hereby imposed a two cent local option gas tax upon every gallon of motor fuel and special fuel sold in Jefferson County and taxed under provisions of F.S. ch. 206 and F.S. § 336.025.
- (c) The tax imposition hereby made shall be for a period of six years commencing on September 1, 2013, terminating December 31, 2019.
- (d) The tax imposed hereby shall be collected and distributed in accordance with the procedures set forth in F.S. § 336.025 (2).
- (e) This ordinance was passed to continue the two cent local option gas tax enabled by prior ordinance 87-01 and extended by prior ordinances 92-04, 97-01, 02-01, and 07-08 with the effective date of imposition and collection being January 1, 2014.
- (f) The proceeds of the tax imposed herby shall be distributed in accordance with the transportation expenditures formula as provided under F.S. § 336.025 (4)(a), as between Jefferson County and City of Monticello, the municipality representing a majority of the population if the incorporated area within Jefferson County.

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ARTICLE III. - TOURIST DEVELOPMENT TAX

Sec. 32-48. - Levied.

(a) There is hereby levied and imposed a tourist development tax throughout the county at the rate of two percent of each whole and major fraction of each dollar of the total rental and consideration charged every person who rents, leases or lets for consideration any living quarters or accommodations in any hotel, apartment hotel, motel, resort motel, apartment, apartment motel, roominghouse, mobile home park, recreational vehicle park

- or condominium for a term of six months or less. When receipt of consideration is by way of property other than money, the tax shall be levied and imposed on the fair market value of such nonmonetary considerations.
- (b) The tourist development tax shall be in addition to any other tax imposed pursuant to F.S. ch. 212, and in addition to all other taxes, fees and the considerations for the rental or lease.
- (c) The tourist development tax shall be charged by the person receiving the consideration for the rental or lease, and it shall be collected by such person from the lessee, tenant or customer at the time of payment of the consideration for such rental or lease.
- (d) The person receiving the consideration for such rental or lease shall receive, account for and remit the tax to the state department of revenue, at the time and in the manner provided for persons who collect and remit taxes under F.S. § 212.03. The same duties and privileges imposed by F.S. ch. 212, upon dealers in tangible property, respecting the collection and remission of tax, the making of returns, the keeping of books, records and accounts, and compliance with the rules of the state department of revenue in the administration of F.S. ch. 212 shall apply to and be binding upon all persons who are subject to the provisions of this article; provided, however, the department of revenue may authorize a quarterly return and payment when the tax remitted by the person receiving the consideration for such rental or lease for the preceding quarter did not exceed \$25.00 for such amount as set by law.
- (e) Collections received by said department of revenue from the tax, less costs of administration as allowed by law, shall be paid and returned on a monthly basis to the county for use by the county in accordance with the provisions of this article and shall be placed in the tourist development tax trust fund established by the county.
