Joint Workshop Meeting January 25, 2018 Monticello City Hall 6:00 P.M.

The Board met this date in a Workshop meeting with the Monticello City Council. Present were Chairman Stephen Fulford, Gene Hall, and Stephen Walker. Present for the City Council were Mayor John Jones, Vice-Mayor George Evans, Troy Avera, Julie Conley, and Steve Rissman. Also present for the County were County Attorney Buck Bird and County Clerk Tim Sanders. Also present for the City were City Clerk Emily Anderson and City Manager Steve Wingate.

- 1. The Joint meeting was called to order by Mayor Jones, who explained that the purpose of the joint meeting was to discuss economic development strategies and planning for the city and county.
- 2. Chairman Fulford reported on the Board's present direction, which is to utilize county staff to respond to economic development inquiries.
- 3. Council Member Conley shared an observation that the county was in a better position to take the lead in economic development with the city being a recruitment tool for the county.
- 4. Council Member Avera opined that the city with its existing infrastructure should collaborate and partner with the county in its efforts to attract new businesses.
- 5. By consensus the existing assets of the Economic Development Council (EDC) would be returned proportionately to the city and county.
- 6. Chairman Fulford explained that he was working with Property Appraiser Angela Gray, Chamber Executive Director Katrina Richardson, County Coordinator Parrish Barwick, and Phil Calandra to help formulate a direction for economic development in the county. By consensus City Manager Wingate was added to said committee to provide information related to the city, such as utilities and infrastructure.
- 7. At the request of Council Member Rissman, Mr. Sanders shared the City of Madison's and Madison County's shared economic development efforts to attract new businesses and industry.
- 8. In conclusion, it was the consensus of the two bodies to move forward together as a group in the city's and county's economic development efforts.

The Board met this date in regular session. Present were Chairman Stephen Fulford, Commissioners Betsy Barfield, Eugene Hall, JT Surles and Stephen Walker. Also present were County Attorneys Buck Bird and Scott Shirley, County Coordinator Parrish Barwick and Chief Deputy Clerk Tyler McNeill.

- 1. Chairman Fulford led the invocation and pledge of allegiance.
- 2. PUBLIC HEARING: Ordinance #2018-020118-01: All-Terrain Vehicles on Unpaved Roads. Attorney Scott Shirley introduced this item and provided an overview of the ordinance. He also noted that there was a minor revision made necessary by a portion of the road being recently paved. Attorney Shirley also stated this was a single reading ordinance and this would be the only public hearing. On motion by Commissioner Walker, seconded by Commissioner Barfield and unanimously carried, the Board adopted the ordinance with the amended language provided by Attorney Shirley.
- 3. County Coordinator Parrish Barwick requested item 5b—US Hwy 19
  Beautification Project— be removed from General Business for a future meeting.
  County Engineer Rob Davis stated it was good news on the maintenance of the
  US Highway 19 project but requested it be pushed to the next meeting.
  Commissioner Barfield requested that item 5a—Surplus of County Property—be
  removed from the agenda. Commissioner Hall requested that an item—Resolution
  for Lance corporal Clyde Alexander—be added to the agenda. On motion by
  Commissioner Walker, seconded by Commissioner Hall and unanimously
  carried, the consent agenda—including the approval of agenda as amended,
  the General/Transportation Fund Vouchers and the Minutes of the January
  18<sup>th</sup>, 2018 Regular Session—was approved.
- 4. County Coordinator Barwick introduced the Road Bond construction projects item. He provided a list of roads to the Board and stated the document is a suggestion but the decision is ultimately the Board's. He recommended the Board take the packet home and prioritize/rank roads in their district and then return to provide him with directions on how to proceed. Commissioner Walker requested a 6<sup>th</sup> column be added to the sheet for any roads that present conflicts for Commissioners. Commissioner Barfield inquired if County Coordinator Barwick was going to run two road crews during this round of road bond paving, to which County Coordinator stated not to begin with but he was looking at running seven hauling trucks. County Coordinator Barwick stated the paving should be completed within three years. Commissioner Barfield requested that as each road is completed, that the Board be presented with a report on how much was spent with the cost of rock, cost of asphalt and the length of the road. Commissioner Barfield inquired if more employees would be hired at the Road Department, to which County Coordinator Barwick stated possibly two temporary drivers if the Road Department is able to get two more trucks. Chairman Fulford requested that the current SCRAP/SCOP schedule be incorporated on a future iteration of the road document. Citizen Phil Calandra noted that the 2012 road bond was intended to pave 25-28 miles of road, but due to County Coordinator Barwick's efforts

over 40 miles of road were paved. Mr. Calandra stated that in 2012, the committee that ranked roads used objective factors in their rankings and also allowed subjective portion from both the Road Superintendent and head of the School Board's bus barn. Mr. Calandra also recommended the Board reach out to the City for a possible inter-local agreement for roads such as Pearl Street. Chairman Fulford stated that it is the city's intent to keep their portion of gas tax money to do roads in the city. Citizen John Nelson thanked the Board for moving forward with the road bond. Chairman Fulford inquired about Fornes Road, to which County Coordinator Barwick stated he would research.

- 5. Commissioner Hall introduced resolution 2018-020118-01 for Lance Corporal Clemens "Clyde" Alexander. He stated the Board previously approved a resolution but this iteration provided the language and wording as recommended by Representative Halsey Beshears. He further stated it was the intent that a portion of US-90 recognized/be in memory of Clyde Alexander. On motion by Commissioner Hall, seconded by Commissioner Walker and unanimously carried, the Board adopted the resolution to send to Representative Beshears.
- 6. Citizen Paul Henry stated he was proud of the Board's work on the road paving and also thanked the attorneys for all of their efforts.
- 7. County Coordinator Barwick introduced the surplus property items. On motion by Commissioner Barfield, seconded by Commissioner Walker and unanimously carried, the Board approved the surplus of the Solid Waste PeterBuilt front load garbage truck. County Coordinator Barwick noted the Solid Waste department has already acquired a replacement vehicle. On motion by Commissioner Barfield, seconded by Commissioner Walker and unanimously carried, the Board approved the surplus of the Extension Office's Crown Victoria. County Coordinator Barwick stated the Extension Office was in need of a new vehicle and that he would like authorization to move forward with acquiring a vehicle to be paid for over a three-year lease. On motion by Commissioner Walker, seconded by Commissioner Surles and unanimously carried, the Board approved the lease of the vehicle for the Extension Office. County Coordinator Barwick stated anything not in the budget for this year would be provided in the subsequent two years' budgets.
- 8. County Coordinator Barwick introduced the old Extension Office item and stated a commercial appraisal had been performed but it would not be a good business practice to release the number publicly because it could possibly be put out for sealed bid. He noted that significant improvements would be needed unless the Board sold the building "as-is." Chairman Fulford recommended the building be sold as-is, to which Commissioner Surles concurred and stated he would like to see it done via sealed bid. On motion by Commissioner Barfield, seconded by Commissioner Hall and unanimously carried, the Board approved the surplus sale of the old Extension Office building via the sealed bid process. The Board discussed a 45-day period to allow sealed bids to be submitted.
- 9. County Coordinator Barwick introduced and questioned a change order on the A building and stated the architect had provided information to Clerk of Court Tim Sanders. This item was placed on the next agenda for further discussion. He also

stated the Legislative Committee will reach out to Representative Beshears and Senator Montford for possible future appropriation from the state.

- 10. Commissioner Fulford provided a recap of the joint workshop held with the City Council regarding economic development. He also noted the EDC website was being transitioned into the County's name and that the EDC was in the process of formally disbanding. Commissioner Barfield inquired about NFEDP's involvement to which Chairman Fulford stated it was presently via a month-to-month contract. Commissioner Barfield also noted there were 3-4 lots available for development at the Industrial Park but lots of wetlands there as well. In addition, she commented on a recent study that listed the most attractive lands for potential developers and wanted it noted on the record for future discussion. Commissioner Barfield also stated an overlay map for the Lloyd or US-19 interchange was something the Board may need to look at in the future.
- 11. Commissioner Hall complimented the work performed on West Lake Road
- 12. Commissioner Barfield discussed the state expenditure plan for the BP oil spill and stated there was a draft out for comments with a meeting scheduled on February 8<sup>th</sup> for a final vote.
- 13. Commissioner Barfield stated she was receiving phone calls about the detour on Lloyd Creek Road and asked Sheriff McNeill if he could have a presence on Barrington Road from 4-7 pm to discourage people speeding in this area. She also requested FDOT be approached about signs.
- 14. Commissioner Walker requested a list of roads in need of striping be developed. Chairman Fulford stated road bond money could possibly be used for some of the striping. Commissioner Barfield requested that the road bond work be bid out so the process could begin. Chairman Fulford concurred and requested they start putting documents together to go out for bid.
- 15. The warrant register was reviewed and bills ordered paid.
- 16. On motion by Commissioner Walker, seconded by Commissioner Surles and unanimously carried, the meeting was adjourned.

# MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE FLORIDA INSTITUTE OF EDUCATION at the UNIVERSITY OF NORTH FLORIDA AND THE JEFFERSON COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS/ JEFFERSON COUNTY R.J. BAILAR PUBLIC LIBRARY

The Florida Institute of Education at the University of North Florida, (hereinafter called "FIE"), enters into this Agreement with the Jefferson County Board of County Commissioners/Jefferson County R.J. Bailar Public Library (hereinafter called "Sponsor");

WHEREAS, Sponsor desires that FIE provide counsel, support, and evaluation services for the Jefferson County Literacy Alliance (JCLA), and FIE has agreed to do so under the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and mutual covenants herein contained, the parties hereto agree to the following:

#### Article 1. Scope of Work

#### UNIVERSITY OF NORTH FLORIDA through the FLORIDA INSTITUTE OF EDUCATION - FIE:

- see attached Scope of Work and Detailed Budget (Attachment A).

#### Article 2. Period of Performance

The period of performance under this Agreement is specified as October 1, 2017 through September 30, 2018, unless sooner terminated in accordance with the terms herein. An annual report shall be submitted as detailed in Attachment B.

#### Article 3. Key Personnel

FIE shall provide Drs. Madelaine Cosgrove and Janice Wood as the primary researchers for work under this agreement. Other FIE researchers and/or staff may also provide needed services.

Sponsor shall provide Natalie Binder as the Sponsor Representative for work under this Agreement.

#### Article 4. Fixed Price: Cost and Payment Schedule:

For the services, counsel, evaluation, and report, Sponsor shall pay FIE on a fixed-price basis in the amount of \$79,908. FIE shall submit invoices for work performed as defined in the Scope of Work and Detailed Budget (Attachment A). Sponsor agrees to pay FIE for the total amount billed upon receipt of invoices from FIE based on the following schedule:

#### **AMOUNT: PAYMENT DATE**

- First payment of \$40,000 will be due upon execution of the Memorandum of Understanding;
- Second payment of \$19,954 to be invoiced March 16, 2018 and due within ten (10) business days of receipt of invoice from FIE;
- Final payment of \$19,954 to be invoiced September 14, 2018 and due within ten (10) business days of receipt of invoice from FIE.

#### Payments made payable to THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH FLORIDA to be sent to:

Florida Institute of Education at the University of North Florida Attention: Terri Cook 12000 Alumni Drive Jacksonville, Florida 32224

#### Article 5. Independent Contractor

FIE is an independent contractor and shall be free to exercise its discretion and independent judgment as to the method and means of performance of the services agreed to by the Sponsor.

#### Article 6. Non-Indemnification

Neither party shall by reason of this Agreement be obligated to defend, assume the cost of defense, hold harmless, or indemnify the other from any liability to third parties for loss of or damage to property, death, or bodily injury arising out of or connected with the work under this Agreement.

#### Article 7. Publicity

Neither party may use the name of the other party in news releases, publicity, advertising, or product promotion without the prior written consent of an authorized official of that party. The Key Personnel named in Article 3 of this agreement can grant this consent on behalf of FIE.

Notwithstanding the above, FIE may release the following information without prior approval of the Sponsor. FIE may include the Sponsor's name, project title, and total contract value in internal and external reports of awards received. FIE may, in response to a public records request, release the name of the FIE researcher, the title and a brief description of the project, the Sponsor's name, and the amount of funding for the project.

#### Article 8. Rights in Data, Copyrights and Publication

Title to data first produced or composed by FIE employees in the performance of work under this Agreement shall be the sole and exclusive property of FIE. FIE shall have the sole right to determine the disposition of intellectual property rights resulting from the project, provided, however, that FIE shall grant to Sponsor permission to reproduce, modify and use ABC Easy as 1, 2, 3 materials to support the overarching goal of the Jefferson County Literacy Alliance at no cost.

Title to and the right to determine the disposition of any copyrights relating to the performance of the work hereunder shall remain with FIE, who shall have the sole right to determine the disposition of those copyrights.

Sponsor recognizes the results of the project must be publishable and Sponsor agrees that FIE shall be permitted to present at symposia, national, or regional professional meetings, and to publish in journals, theses or dissertations, or otherwise of FIE's own choosing.

#### Article 9. Confidentiality and Privacy

Each party will use reasonable efforts to prevent the disclosure of any of the other party's confidential information to third parties. FIE agrees not to disclose the identity of program participants in any publications resulting from this agreement. FIE will not disclose the identity of any participants without a court order. Any data that could be used to identify an individual will be anonymized as soon as possible. Identifying information will not be collected unless necessary, and will not be retained longer than necessary.

#### Article 10. Termination

Either party may terminate this Agreement at any time by giving not less than thirty (30) days advance written notice to the other party. Termination or cancellation shall not affect the rights and obligations of the parties accrued prior to termination.

Sponsor shall be liable for all expenses incurred and all non-cancelable commitments made prior to FIE's receipt of the notice of termination and shall pay FIE for same on receipt of a final invoice.

All notices related to this Agreement given by either party to the other shall be in writing and sent via certified mail or commercial carrier with signature required for delivery and addressed to the following individuals:

#### Article 11. State of Florida Provisions

Any obligations of FIE under the Agreement are subject to all applicable laws and regulations of the State of Florida. Acceptance of this agreement shall certify that Sponsor is aware of Chapter 112, of the Florida Statutes, and other laws and regulations concerning conflicts of interest in dealing with agencies of the State of Florida. For purposes of this Agreement, Sponsor hereby certifies, to the best of its knowledge and belief, (1) that no officer or employee of FIE is also an employee of Sponsor and (2) that no officer or employee of FIE has a contractual relationship with Sponsor. Violation of this section shall be grounds for cancellation of this agreement.

#### Article 12. Governing Law

This Agreement shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Florida.

#### Article 13. Assignment

Neither party to this Agreement may assign their rights and/or duties hereunder without the written permission of the other party.

#### **Article 14. Amendments**

This Agreement may be extended, renewed, or otherwise amended at any time by the mutual written consent of the parties. No modification of this Agreement or waiver of the terms or conditions hereof shall be binding upon either party hereto unless approved in writing by an authorized representative.

#### Article 15. Waiver

The failure of the parties to enforce at any time any of the provisions of this Agreement, or to require at any time performance by the other party of any provisions hereof, shall not be construed to be a waiver of such provisions, or the right of the party to thereafter enforce each and every such provision. No waiver of any breach of the Agreement shall be held to be a waiver of any other or subsequent breach.

#### Article 16. Entire Agreement

This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes all previous agreements and understandings relating to the work to be performed.

Please consider this a request for Amendment number three (#3) for the above referenced project. With this amendment, the County is requesting to amend the budget line item amounts, request a sixty (60) day time extension and revise the activity work plans to more accurately reflect the pace of the project.

Currently the County has completed the rehabilitation of seven (7) homes and the replacement of one (1) home. Contracts have been signed for the three (3) remaining homes and all three (3) homes are under construction. The homes are scheduled to be completed by March 20, 2018; however the County would like to request an additional sixty (60) in case there are any unforeseen incidents (change orders, weather delays, etc).

Additionally, the County would like to move unencumbered funds in the amount \$4,500.00 from the Administration line item and \$2,500.00 from the temporary relocation line item into the Housing Rehabilitation line item. During the slab preparation for the replacement home located at 33 Curtis Mills Rd, Monticello, FL in unincorporated Jefferson County, it was determined that the soil was unstable and additional engineering and foundation design had to be completed. This additional work resulted in a change order which will exceed the Housing Rehabilitation line item amount of \$575,000.000. This amendment request will increase the housing rehabilitation line item to \$582,000.00. This amendment will not result in a decrease in the application score or beneficiary information.
