BIKE TRAIL AGREEMENT

THIS TRAIL AGREEMENT (this "AGREEMENT"), made this 3rd day of January 2019, by and between DUKE ENERGY FLORIDA, LLC, a Florida Liability Company d/b/a Duke Energy, a Florida Corporation (hereinafter referred to as "DUKE ENERGY") whose address is 3300 Exchange Place, Lake Mary, Florida, 32746 and JEFFERSON COUNTY, a political subdivision of the State of Florida (hereinafter referred to as "COUNTY");

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, DUKE ENERGY is the owner of the fee simple title of those certain lands presently serving as right-of-way corridors for DUKE ENERGY's network of electric transmission and distribution lines and certain other lands in the county of Jefferson and cited for reference on attached hereto as **Exhibit "A"** and by this reference incorporated herein and made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, the above-cited deeds of conveyance and/or easement documents, which shall be referred to hereinafter collectively as DUKE ENERGY's Property, afford DUKE ENERGY the right, by appropriate legal means, to restrict any use of the said right-of-way corridors which is inconsistent with the safe and efficient construction, reconstruction, operation or maintenance of DUKE ENERGY's existing or future facilities therein; and

WHEREAS, COUNTY desires to occupy and utilize a portion of said lands for the purposes of operating a multi-use trail, as described in the attached **Exhibit "B"** (sometimes referred to herein as "COUNTY's Utilization or The Trail"), which utilization shall not interfere with DUKE ENERGY's continued operation and maintenance of DUKE ENERGY's current and future high voltage electric transmission and distribution lines and related facilities located thereon; and

WHEREAS, this AGREEMENT is for the purpose of recognizing the COUNTY's Utilization of DUKE ENERGY'S Property as a multi-use trail for the public, and to provide for cooperation and access during the use and maintenance of said trail; and

WHEREAS, DUKE ENERGY is willing to grant to the COUNTY the desired occupancy and utilization, subject to certain terms and conditions.

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the benefits herein provided, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties hereby agree as follows:

The above recitals are incorporated herein as if set forth herein.

A. DUKE ENERGY hereby authorizes COUNTY to operate and maintain a twelve (12) foot wide multi-use trail (the "Trail") over those portions of DUKE ENERGY's Property as depicted in **Exhibit "B"** which is attached and incorporated herein, which has been reviewed and approved by DUKE ENERGY. For purposes of this Agreement the term Trail shall also be deemed to mean the Multi Use Paths or Shared Use Paths as defined by AASHTO (American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials).

- B. Compliance with the said location and specifications depicted on said **Exhibit "B"** is necessary and essential to render the COUNTY's Utilization of DUKE ENERGY's Property consistent with DUKE ENERGY's continued operation and maintenance needs of DUKE ENERGY's high voltage electric transmission and distribution lines and related facilities located thereon. Any breach of the plans or specifications depicted on **Exhibit "B"** shall permit DUKE ENERGY to be able to shut the Trail down without liability to COUNTY until the breach is remedied to comply with **Exhibit "B." Exhibit "B"** shall not be modified or changed without the express written approval of DUKE ENERGY.
- C. All of COUNTY's activities, operations, and equipment used within the Trail, either beneath or in proximity to any of DUKE ENERGY'S facilities shall at all times be in strict compliance with the applicable provisions of the National Electrical Safety Code, the Occupational Safety and Health Administration, and any other applicable Federal, State and Local Requirements.
- D. The Trail shall be for the benefit of public use and enjoyment.
- E. The COUNTY hereby agrees to notify the COUNTY's employees, agents, contractors, representatives, or other persons modifying or maintaining the Trail, and to post notices along the Trail notifying the Public and all persons engaging in COUNTY's activities within said DUKE ENERGY's Property, that extreme caution is necessary around all of DUKE ENERGY's electrical facilities, supporting structures, anchor guys or related appurtenances, and in the event of any damages or injuries, the COUNTY shall immediately report the nature and extent thereof to DUKE ENERGY's nearest local office. COUNTY agrees to put up signs along that portion of the Trail within DUKE ENERGY's Property stating that "the Trail is owned and maintained by the COUNTY". The signs shall provide COUNTY's current phone number to call for maintenance concerns or emergencies.
- F. The Trail must not exceed a total of twelve (12') feet in width, regardless of the surface construction material.
- G. A minimum separation of twenty-five (25') feet is required between the Trail or shoulder or associated grading and any DUKE ENERGY electrical support structures or related facility. This includes, but is not limited to, poles, towers, guy anchor(s), equipment, etc.
- H. The COUNTY shall be responsible for safety and liability associated with the operation, maintenance and use of the Trail.

- I. Bollards shall be installed by COUNTY at its sole cost and expense per DUKE ENERGY specifications, with DUKE ENERGY locks, where the Trail heads connect with roads/streets as to prevent vehicular traffic.
- J. DUKE ENERGY may require reinforcement of the Trail at specified access points along the corridor for DUKE ENERGY heavy equipment crossings. These Trail reinforcement areas shall consist of a twenty (20') foot long, twelve (12') foot wide paved area capable of supporting 80,000 lbs. with pavement markings indicating "heavy equipment crossing".
- K. Culverts shall be installed where the Trail crosses creeks, ditches, etc. These culverts shall be capable of supporting 80,000 lbs, and shall be a minimum of twenty feet (20') wide. Signage must indicate the maximum load of the crossing at culvert approach.
- L. Other than DUKE ENERGY's facilities, and those facilities approved and shown on the construction plans for the Trail within DUKE ENERGY's Property, no structures including, but not limited to, lights, signs, benches, exercise equipment, irrigation systems, overhead wires, poles, light standards, dumpsters, trees, buildings, obstacles or other facilities shall be located, constructed or installed within DUKE ENERGY's Property
- M. All operation, use and maintenance of the Trail and planting of vegetation shall adhere to the Shared Use Path/Trail Guidelines which are attached hereto and incorporated herein as **Exhibit "C"**. There shall be no planting of any new vegetation on or along the Trail without DUKE ENERGY'S prior written consent.
- N. DUKE ENERGY reserves the right to close, without notice, all or a portion of the Trail located within DUKE ENERGY'S Property, for any length of time, for maintenance or emergency line operations, but shall provide the COUNTY with notice of any such closing at least two (2) weeks in advance whenever reasonably practical.
- O. Except as otherwise provided herein, DUKE ENERGY will not be held responsible for any damages to the Trail due to DUKE ENERGY's operations or for any liability based on the use of the Trail. DUKE ENERGY shall not be liable for any damages to the COUNTY's Utilization or operation of the Trail whatsoever resulting from DUKE ENERGY's continued use and occupancy of DUKE ENERGY's Property with the understanding that DUKE ENERGY shall not willfully cause damage to or unreasonably interfere with the COUNTY's Utilization. DUKE ENERGY agrees to notify the COUNTY immediately if it inadvertently damages any of the Trail while maintaining DUKE ENERGY's infrastructure, and further agrees to take steps to temporarily ensure that said damaged area is properly identified and secured from public access. However, COUNTY agrees that it will repair, at its sole costs, any damage that DUKE ENERGY may cause to the Trail during DUKE ENERGY's construction, operation and maintenance of its facilities.

- P. COUNTY acknowledges that its use of the Trail and/or DUKE ENERGY's Property shall be at COUNTY's sole risk and expense. Except as otherwise provided herein, DUKE ENERGY shall in no way be liable to COUNTY or any third party for any costs, expenses, losses, damages, or liabilities incurred by COUNTY or any third party in its use of DUKE ENERGY's Property. Each party agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the other, its officials and employees from all claims, actions, losses, suits, judgments, fines, liabilities, costs and expenses (including attorney's fees) attributable to its own negligent acts or omissions, or those of its officials and employees acting within the scope of their employment, or arising out of or resulting from its negligent performance under this Agreement. Nothing contained herein shall constitute a waiver of COUNTY's sovereign immunity or the provisions of section 768.28, Florida Statutes. The foregoing shall not constitute an agreement by either party to assume any liability for the acts, omissions and/or negligence of the other party.
- Q. Without waiving its right to sovereign immunity as provided in section 768.28, Florida Statutes, COUNTY acknowledges to be self-insured for General Liability and Automobile Liability with coverage limits of as set forth in Section 768.28, Florida Statutes. COUNTY agrees to maintain commercial insurance or to be self-insured for Workers' Compensation & Employers' Liability in accordance with Chapter 440, Florida Statutes. Upon request, COUNTY shall provide an affidavit or Certificate of Insurance evidencing self-insurance or commercial insurance up to sovereign immunity limits, which DUKE ENERGY agrees to find acceptable for the coverage mentioned above. DUKE ENERGY's failure to request proof of insurance or to identify any deficiency in coverage or compliance with the foregoing requirements shall not relieve COUNTY of its liability and obligations under this Agreement. COUNTY shall require all contractors performing work within DUKE ENERGY's Property to procure and maintain workers' compensation, commercial general liability, business auto liability and contractor's pollution liability coverage. DUKE ENERGY shall be named as an additional insured on all general liability policies.
- R. As a safeguard in respect to Paragraph "P" above, COUNTY will carry, and/or will cause all of its contractors to carry, policies of insurance acceptable to DUKE ENERGY with respect to General Liability insuring against all risks to all persons or entities which may sustain property damage or personal injury as a result of the combined acts and omissions of the COUNTY or DUKE ENERGY, which may be related in any way to COUNTY's use of the Trail or DUKE ENERGY's Property, with Bodily Injury limits not less than \$2,000,000 each person and \$5,000,000 each occurrence and with Property Damage limits not less than \$500,000 each occurrence and \$1,000,000 aggregate. DUKE ENERGY shall be named as an additional insured on such insurance policies. COUNTY will have the insurance policies mentioned endorsed by their insurance carrier to provide blanket contractual coverage expressly with respect to Paragraph "P" above, to the full limits of and for the liabilities insured under said policies. Prior to commencing initial construction activities within the right-of-way and/or easement, COUNTY will furnish DUKE ENERGY with a fully completed

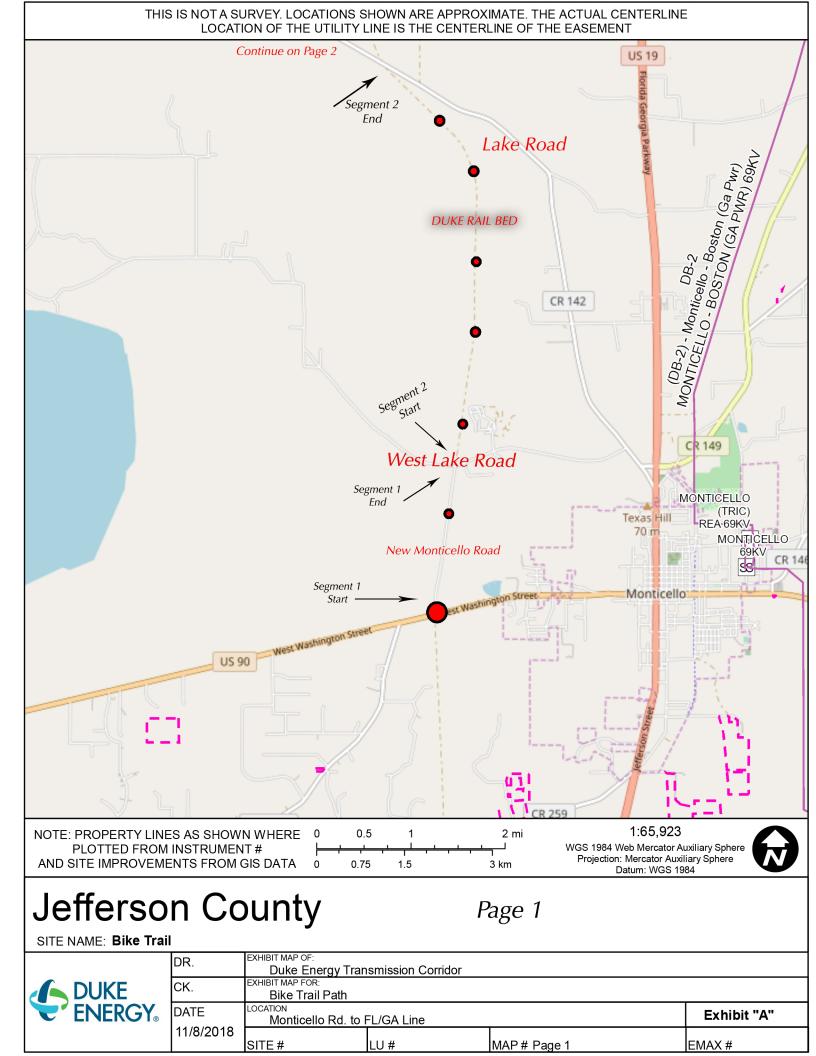
- certificate of insurance, in duplicate, evidencing insurance coverage of the liability assumed under said Paragraph "P."
- S. COUNTY shall adhere to applicable regulatory provisions regarding clearances between ground level and electric conductors. DUKE ENERGY's Property contains or will contain high voltage power lines. Extreme caution must be used when working within the Trail and within DUKE ENERGY's Property.
- T. The area within DUKE ENERGY's Property which is disturbed by the COUNTY's Utilization, shall be restored by the COUNTY to a condition at least as good as that which existed prior to construction.
- U. COUNTY shall be responsible for clean-up of any and all hazardous material spills resulting from the COUNTY's Utilization which may occur within DUKE ENERGY's Property. If a hazardous material spill occurs within DUKE ENERGY's property, the COUNTY shall immediately report the nature and extent of the spill to DUKE ENERGY's nearest local office.
- V. COUNTY shall be responsible for maintaining the Trail in a condition compatible with the surrounding area.
- W. COUNTY agrees that no burning, refueling or permanent stockpiling of dirt or other materials is allowed within DUKE ENERGY's property.
- X. COUNTY agrees to furnish DUKE ENERGY'S Asset Protection Specialist, currently Ethan Pardue, with a set of as-built drawings of the COUNTY's utilization area within thirty (30) days of completion of construction, noting the location of the COUNTY's improvements within DUKE ENERGY's Property and DUKE ENERGY's nearest structures.
- Y. DUKE ENERGY does not guarantee that COUNTY's Utilization will be completely compatible with the safe and efficient operation and maintenance of DUKE ENERGY's existing and future high voltage electric transmission and distribution lines within DUKE ENERGY's Property
- Z. In the event that COUNTY's utilization interferes with DUKE ENERGY'S present or future use of the subject Property, COUNTY agrees to relocate or adjust the Trail at COUNTY's sole cost and expense.
- AA. Should COUNTY decide, at its sole discretion, that relocation or adjustment of the Trail pursuant to Section Z herein is impossible, impractical or not in the best interests of COUNTY, COUNTY agrees to reimburse DUKE ENERGY for all expenses associated with the relocation of any existing DUKE ENERGY facilities necessitated by COUNTY's utilization.

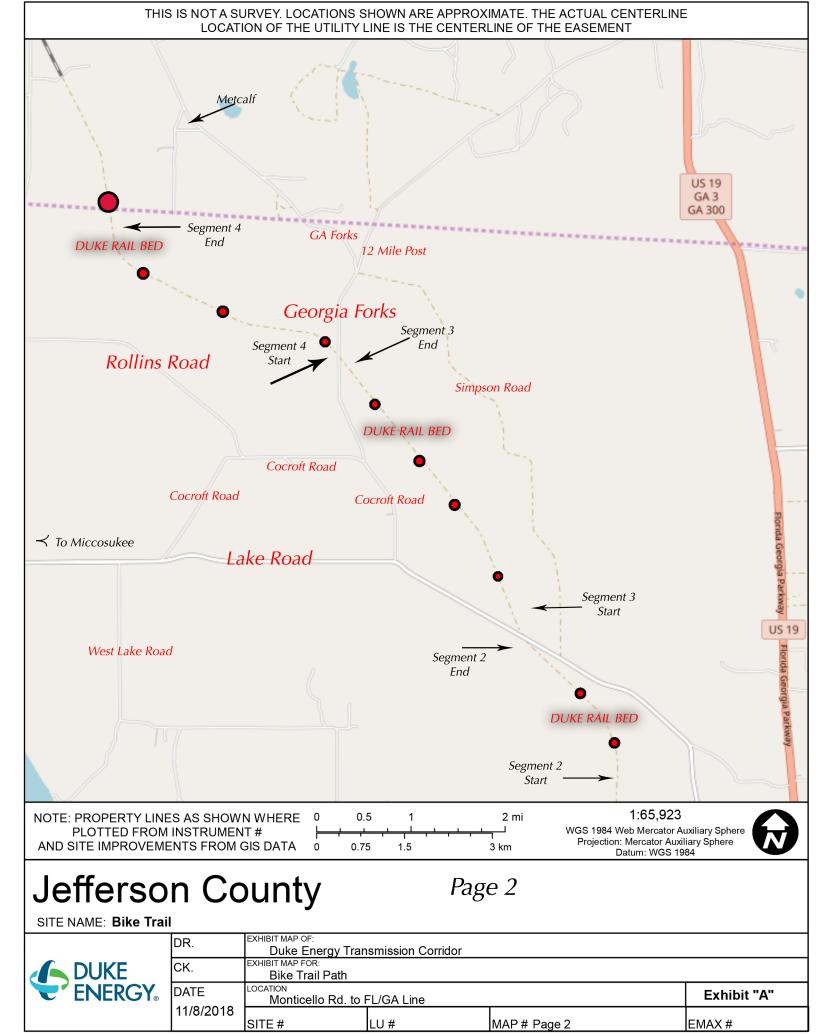
- BB. DUKE ENERGY's Asset Protection Specialist (currently Ethan Pardue 352-694-8548) shall be notified by COUNTY at least fourteen (14) days prior to COUNTY's commencement of initial activities within DUKE ENERGY's Property.
- CC. This Agreement shall not be assigned or transferred, in whole or in part, by COUNTY without the express written consent of DUKE ENERGY.
- DD. This AGREEMENT shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns.

Exhibit "B"

- 1. Trailheads: Given the length of the trail from the main trailhead and potential connection with future trails or greenways, this trail is viewed as a potential destination for some users. While the trail will begin at New Monticello Road and West Lake Road the intent is to locate the primary trailhead at city center in the parking lot behind the Tax Collection (500 West Walnut Street) in Monticello. Parking is available along with restrooms for trail users.
- 2. Amenities: Except for signage, no amenities are planned for the trail
 - a) Signage:
 - Regulatory (safety, rules, regulations) addressing access and usage highlighting the prohibition to accessing adjacent private lands
 - Directional (mile markers, landmarks, connections)
 - Interpretive (educations)
 - Exercise (could be incorporated with directional mile markers)
- 3. Trail Form: The trail will have a width of between 8 to 12 feet and will be placed on the raised portion of the railbed. Existing access crossings for land owners with property adjacent to the trail will remain intact and usable by land owners.
- 4. Surface Material: The trail surface shall consist of a variety of surfaces including crushed stone (road base) and a natural earth surface. The surface shall offer inexpensive maintenance costs limited primarily to fixing drainage problems, repairing eroded areas and removing vegetation. This type of trail can usually be built and maintained by volunteers.
- 5. Safety Features at Roadway Crossings: User safety is the ultimate concern in design of the trail. In addition to alignment and surface treatment of the trail, regulatory signage is included to ensure the safety of users.
 - Intersections: There are two primary intersection and one secondary intersection on the length of the trail 1) West Lake Road 2) Lake Road and 3) Georgia Forks Road (secondary). The following safety elements will be included at each street intersection:

 - Bollards Signage (pedestrian & vehicular) • Painted striping at road crossings (except for Georgia Forks – that is a dirt road).
- 6. Trail Maintenance: The trail will be maintained by Jefferson County with support from volunteer users.



Electric Transmission Right of Way Requirements for Shared-Use Paths/Trails

Definition: For purposes of this document the term "trail(s)" shall be used to refer to Multi-Use Paths or Shared-Use Paths as defined by the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO).

- 1. The trails must not exceed a total of 12 feet in width, regardless of the surface construction material.
- 2. A minimum separation of 25 feet is required between the trail and its associated easement, to any Duke Energy electrical facility. This includes, but is not limited to, poles, towers, guy anchor(s), equipment, etc. If the owner of the trail is not the current owner of the fee simple title to the lands underlying Duke Energy's easement, the trail owner shall obtain a legally sufficient easement from the current fee simple title owner and produce said easement to Duke Energy prior to commencing activities within the Duke Energy easement. In the event a private easement is not required, no portion of the trail or shoulder, or associated grading, shall be located within 25 feet of any electrical facility.
- 3. The owner of the trail shall be responsible for safety and liability associated with its construction or use thereof.
- 4. Bollards shall be installed per Duke Energy specifications, with Duke Energy locks, where the trailheads connect with roads/ streets as to prevent vehicular traffic. Duke Energy may require reinforcement of the trail at specified access points along the corridor for Duke Energy heavy equipment crossings. These trail reinforcement areas shall consist of a 20-foot-long, 10-foot-wide paved area capable of supporting 80,000 pounds with pavement markings indicating "heavy equipment crossing."
- 5. Culverts shall be installed where the trails cross creeks, ditches, etc. These culverts shall be capable of supporting 80,000 pounds, and shall be a minimum of 20 feet wide. Signage must indicate the maximum load of the crossing at culvert approach.
- 6. No structures including, but not limited to, lights, signs, benches, exercise equipment, and irrigation systems shall be located within the Duke Energy easement.
- 7. Planting of vegetation shall adhere to the Right of Way (RW) Restrictions Guidelines for the specific Duke Energy territory. A copy of the RW Restrictions/Guidelines can be obtained from your Asset Protection Specialist.
- 8. Duke Energy reserves the right to close, without notice, all or a portion of the trail located within the transmission line easement, for any length of time, for construction, maintenance or emergency line operations.
- 9. Duke Energy will not be held responsible for any damages to the trails due to its operations or any liability based on the use of the trail. Prior to the installation of a shared-use trail, a "Trail Encroachment Agreement", which includes "hold harmless" language, shall be executed with Duke Energy. In addition, deed information of all property owners that the trail affects must be supplied to Duke Energy. Proof that the property owners have signed an easement agreement with the owner of the trail will be required, as applicable.
- 10. All other Duke Energy electric transmission right of way restrictions/guidelines shall apply to the installation of trails.

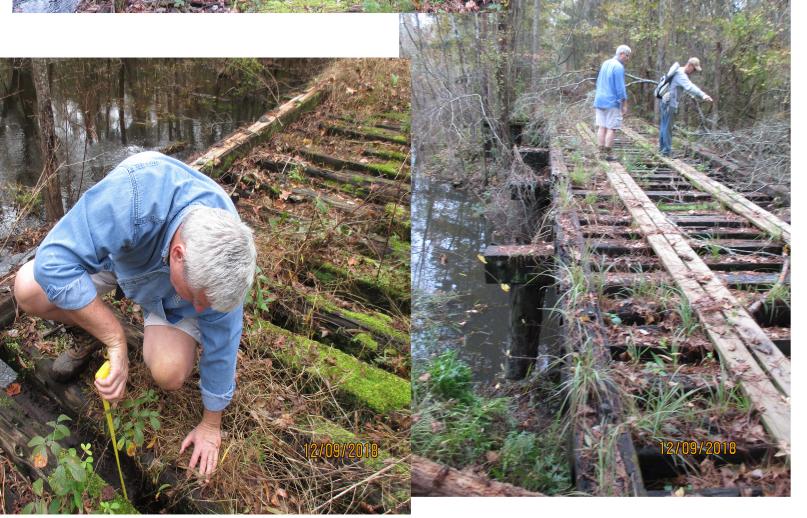

Dear Commissioner Barfield:

As you requested, here is a report of our findings and conclusions regarding the above referenced project.

General Information:

This project is the conversion of three existing rail road bridges for use as public bicycle/pedestrian trail bridgeS. It is our opinion that these bridges are safe for the intended purpose provided that certain repair/improvements are made as noted below.

Background:

On Saturday Dec 5th 2018 along with Mr. Rick Ashton and yourself we visited the site of the three bridges to determine if they are suitable for use a pedestrian/bicycle bridges. At the time of our visit the train rails had been removed. The bridge we reviewed are at the locations noted below:

- North Bridge across an un-named tributary of Ward Creek and consisting of eight twelve foot spans
- Middle Bridge across an un-named tributary of Ward Creek and consisting of eight twelve foot spans
- South Bridge across an un-named tributary of Ward Creek and consisting of four twelve foot spans

Each bridge was similarly constructed of treated timber as follows - 6x8 timber cross ties spaced 14" apart were supported by two 16" wide, 33" deep timber beams spaced 5 feet apart, these in turn were supported by large timber pile caps and timber piling. Each end of the bridges included earth retaining walls also constructed of timber.

With the exception of the cross ties, the bridges are in excellent condition and certainly capable of supporting the loads associated with a pedestrian/bicycle trail bridge. However, some repairs and modifications will be required as depicted on the attached drawings and generally described below:

- Approximately ¼ of the existing cross ties will need to be removed and replaced with new double 2x10 timber beams. Other cross ties may be abandoned in place and yet others will need to be augmented with double 2x10 timber beams.
- A new timber deck constructed of 2x6 lumber will be required for the walking/travel surface
- New guardrails will be required on each side of the bridges for safety purposes.

With these improvement the bridges will be suitable for the traffic usually associated with these types of facilities (pedestrians, bicycles, horses etc.) as well as light duty vehicles such as pick-up trucks and all-terrain vehicles.

All new lumber should be pressure treated and all new hardware should be galvanized steel. We recommend that the work be done by a professional Contractor who is experienced in this type of construction.
